




Group A Offenses Per 100,000 Riders






Breakdown of Group A Offenses 3rd Qtr FY25





Breakdown of Arrests by Offense 3rd Qtr FY25



TOTAL CALLS FOR SERVICE YTD FY25 VS. FY24








3rd Quarter FY 2025 - MDRT Contacts - 607 April - June 2025






3rd Qtr FY 2025 - MDRT Outcomes - 607 April – June 2025




