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Art & Design Program Overview

The DART Art & Design Program was established to achieve the following goals:

- Recognition that art is an important component in the creation of public spaces and public transit.
- Involvement of the community in the design of stations and related artwork.
- Creation of opportunities for maintenance savings through reduced vandalism.

The Silver Line Art & Design Program includes:

- Art and design of 10 stations along the 26-mile Silver Line Corridor.
- A team of architects, artists, engineers, and neighborhood advisory committee members for each station collaborating from station concept to completion.
- Architectural elements including paving and column cladding, site elements, landscaping and site-specific artwork.

Art & Design Program Overview

Board approved the contract award to AWH for design and construction of the Silver Line Regional Rail Project, including nine new regional rail stations for the Silver Line and one new light rail station for the Red Line as follows:

- Shiloh Road Station
- 12th Street Station
- 12th Street Station (LR Red Line)
- CityLine/ Bush Station
- UTD Station
- Knoll Trail Station
- Addison Station
- Downtown Carrollton Station
- Cypress Waters Station
- DFW North Station

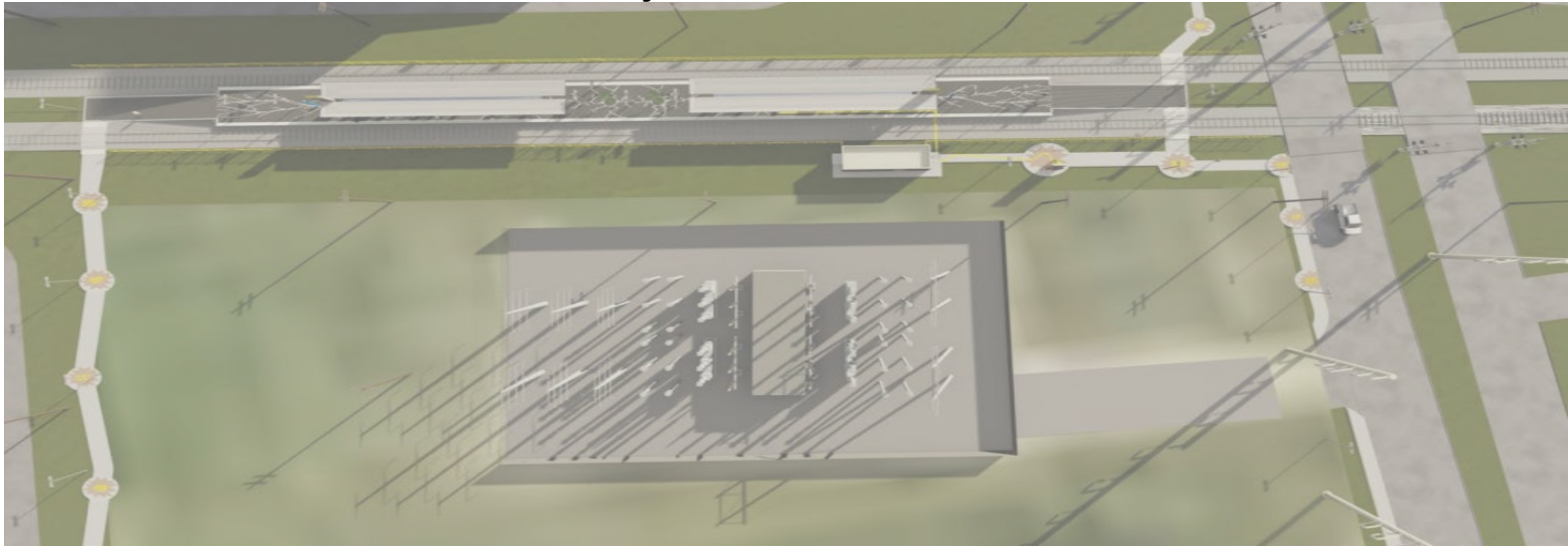

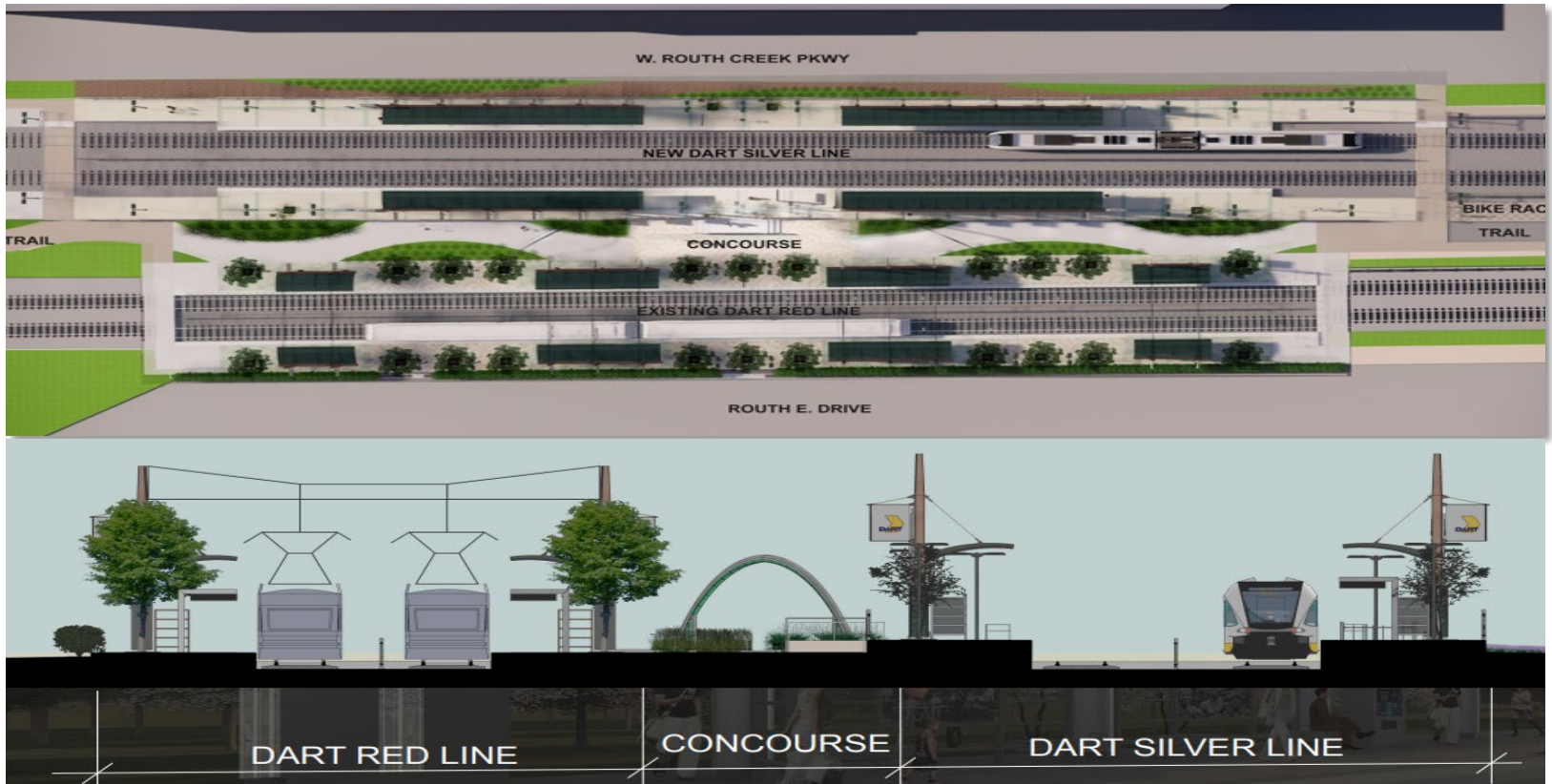

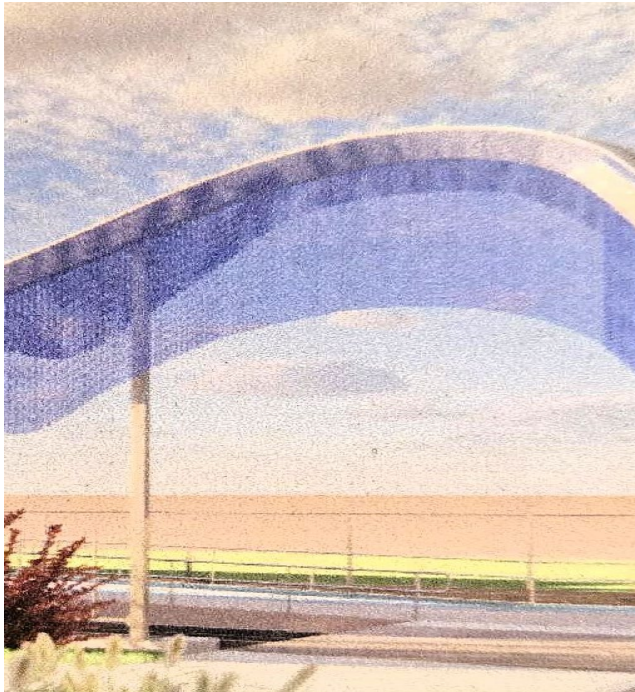
